
Reserve Warden (casual)

Reporting to: Reserve Manager

Main function of post: To take a role in the delivery of all aspects of this internationally important 320-hectare nature reserve including RAMSAR, SPA, SAC and SSSI notifications. Assist with management habitat tasks, ecological monitoring and the achieving of targets set within the reserve management plan and support on delivery of some visitor engagement events.

Responsibilities of the post

1. You will work with the Reserve Manager and Assistant Reserve Manager to help maintain the reserve. Your tasks will include daily operations, using tools and equipment, and assisting with habitat management. You'll also help with the Reserve Management Plan by inputting data and reporting. Additionally, you'll support the design and implementation of environmental schemes, focusing on monitoring and recording.
2. Support delivery of the visitor engagement strategy by delivering walks and talks for the public, ensuring the safety and welfare of such groups and promote WWT membership.
3. To assist with the operation and maintenance site infrastructure in line with agreed procedures and guidelines including paths, hides/observatories, fencing, water level control structures, waymarking, interpretation and all further infrastructure which may be added to the estate.
4. Take responsibility for the supervision of all reserve practical volunteers. Assuring all trust procedures are followed.
5. Help create interesting local and national wildlife stories to attract more visitors to the Centre. Work closely with the Marketing Manager and PR teams to manage events and actively create social media content, including photography, following WWT policies. Accurately monitor species and habitats, and be skilled in identifying various taxa, including birds.

6. Take part in officially sanctioned pest control in line with WWT policy when requested.
7. To be responsible for working within the WWT health and safety policy and guidelines ensuring that the health, safety and wellbeing of yourself and others is an integral part of how you work.
8. To be responsible for engaging with the WWT Sustainability Statement, being aware of negative environmental impacts and incorporating sustainable ways of working within your role.
9. To interact with our visitors and supporters in a positive way, shaping unforgettable experiences and helping them understand and connect to wetlands.
10. To ensure that in the course of your work you adhere to the WWT Data Protection policy and standards.

In addition to the duties and responsibilities listed, the post holder is required to perform any other reasonable duties that may be assigned by the supervisor shown above, from time to time.
